The Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation continues to grow both its endowment assets and granting capacity. The community foundation model is predicated on the concept of permanent endowment assets that provide a perpetual granting ability to serve and support the needs of worthy charities in our community. 2014 into early 2015 has seen continual growth in both areas.

The Foundation has almost \$9 million in endowment-assets that allows the Foundation to provide, annually, over 90 individual grants to worthy charities. In 2014, the dollar-value of grants made was

over \$360,000, which brought the total of grants the Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation has made since inception to approximately \$3.5 million.

The short-term objective, as determined by the Board of Directors in 2012, is to grow the endowment-assets of the Foundation to \$10 million by the end of 2016. At that point, the Foundation is expected to be granting over \$400,000 annually to charities. The growth of the Foundation beyond the \$10 million mark will be an exciting time, as the size of the Foundation will enable an even greater impact in the charitable sector of our community.

One of the highlights in 2014 included the Foundation's annual OPAL Gala, which recognized Mrs. Lois Rice as the Chair's Living Legacy Award Recipient 2014. It was a great honour to have Mrs. Rice receive our award, as Lois is such an amazing person; one of the first supporters of the Foundation, with her late-husband, Maxwell, in 2002; a tremendous advocate and supporter of charities throughout the community.

There are many charities in Caledon and Brampton that do great work. Whether it's the work of a food bank, a hospice or a women's shelter, these charities give the necessary social supports that help those in need. The Foundation, through the donations and goodwill of its fundholders, is proud to be the vehicle through which donors and philanthropists provide the help and support to these charities that improve our society.

The Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation remains true to its vision and mandate, and together we build our community today. . . tomorrow. . . forever.

PUTTING DOWN ROOTS

WHAT IS A COMMUNITY FOUNDATION?

A community foundation is a locally-run, incorporated, independent public foundation that:

- › Builds and manages endowment and other types of funds to support charitable activities in its area
- › Is autonomous and governed by a volunteer board of local leaders
- › Exist in every province and one territory and are linked and supported at the national level through Community Foundations of Canada. There are over 190 community foundations in Canada.

WHAT IS AN ENDOWMENT FUND?

An endowment fund is a sum of money that you have designated or allocated for the specific purpose of charitable giving. Initial capital donations to your endowment fund are not spent. The money is invested with interest earned being used to support an annual grant to the charity of your choosing. Because the endowment model employed by a community foundation favours capital preservation, your fund will exist in perpetuity to help fund the charitable causes that are most meaningful to you and your family...today...tomorrow...forever!

WHY GIVE TO A COMMUNITY FOUNDATION?

- › Create a family legacy that will inspire and educate your kids, grand-kids and their families in the importance of charitable giving and giving back to their community
- › Your capital donations are secure
- › You can participate in the process
- › Grants are made only to qualified charities
- › Community foundations practice planned, professional and perpetual charitable giving
- › All capital donations are 100% charitable tax receiptable
- › You can donate cash, securities, life insurance and other gifts to a community foundation
- › A community foundation has membership in the national organization, Community Foundations of Canada, that represents over 190 community foundations across the country
- › Approximately \$150 million was granted, collectively, from Canadian community foundations to worthy charitable organizations and ventures in 2013

WAYS TO GIVE

All capital donations to a community foundation receive a charitable tax receipt for 100% of the donated amount. Donations may be made to your own endowment fund, another's endowment fund, the unrestricted community fund or to support the operations of the Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation.

- › Securities*
- › In-kind donations
- › Estate bequests
- › Life Insurance Policy (Foundation named as beneficiary)

*Gifts of appreciated securities to a community foundation qualify for a 100% taxable gain exemption.

OPAL 2014 CHAIR'S LIVING LEGACY AWARD RECIPIENT – LOIS RICE

At OPAL 2014, the Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation had the distinct pleasure of presenting Mrs. Lois Rice with the Foundation's annual Chair's Living Legacy Award. Lois has given back to the community as a philanthropist for decades. Always supportive of good and worthy causes, Lois has set an example for all to admire and follow.

Lois was born and raised on a farm near Bolton, Ontario, one of two children born to Ed and Della Ewart. Lois met her husband-to-be, Maxwell, one night at the 'nickel' dances at the Bolton Dance Hall in downtown Bolton. They married when Max enlisted in the Air Force during WWII. After the war, Lois and Max settled into their marriage and started a family that would produce three sons.

Max had grown up in a family of carpenters and builders in Toronto, so it was not long before Rice Construction was formed and in the early 1950's, Rice Construction started developing and building in Brampton.

When Lois, Max and their sons moved to Brampton in 1964, Lois became immersed in the social and charitable fabric of the community. Lois is an amazing lady whose energy, commitment and affection for the people in her life are second to none.

Through the Lois and Max Rice Family Fund at the Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation, over 150 grants that have totaled hundreds of thousands of dollars have been granted to worthy charities in our community.

GRANTS THAT WORK

THE BRAMPTON AND CALEDON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION TAKES PRIDE IN MAKING GRANTS THAT WORK IN OUR COMMUNITY:

Caledon Meals on Wheels

The Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation was pleased to support the Caledon Meals on Wheels Enhanced seniors' Program in 2015. Many of the seniors who Caledon Meals on Wheels serve are living with limited mobility, chronic illness and/or disabilities, and are typically aged 70+ years of age. Due to these circumstances, these seniors are at risk of social isolation, depression and poor nutrition due to their increasing age and/or frailty.

Many of these seniors are currently receiving in-home support through the use of Personal Support Workers aiding them in their activities of daily living and/or receiving Meals on Wheels because of their inability to cook.

Support from the Brampton Caledon Community Foundation was used to provide an enhanced 'Fresh Food' program that is alongside its hot and frozen food program. This grant helped provide the fresh food items that might be more difficult to acquire on a regular basis. Food was provided at an affordable price and prepared in a manner that was easy to eat.

Albion Hills Community Farm

The Brampton and Caledon Community Foundation supported an exciting program in 2015 that brought together two leading food and farm organizations, Albion Hills Community Farm (AHCF) and Headwaters Communities in Action (HCIA), to deliver an on-farm based education program. AHCF served as the on-the-ground delivery organization for program development and implementation as it is a working farm with a mandate for education.

On-farm education programs are critical to teaching children, youth, individuals, families and business about where our food comes from. AHCF provides on-farm programs for schools, community groups and individuals. The essence of a community farm is to be a place where people can learn about and how to grow food. In addition, the farm works with the Palgrave School and accommodates other schools that want to visit.

The process for developing the proposed on-farm education program included the following components:

1. Development of the five on-farm program physical components: pumpkin patch, straw bale castle/ outdoor classroom, pollinator, hotel and garden, way finding and information signage, and, veggie planting/harvesting station.
2. Marketing the program to schools in Caledon and Brampton, local outdoor education centres, pre-schools and to members of the public for special events days.

Honeychurch Family Life Resource Centre

Family Homelessness is a growing concern within Peel. This is more evident within the shelter system where families through abuse, financial, and hard times are forced to turn to shelters, housing providers, including social service departments.

Honeychurch Family Life Resource Centre (FLRC) is a woman's shelter in Brampton and, as part of the shelter's Strategic Plan, its aim is to continue to strengthen and support women while assisting them in being independent through job search, resume writing and knowledge of computer skills. When women in the shelter develop job skills they are better equipped to support themselves and their children while continuing to remain independent and break free of a violent relationship. In addition, women who are able to sustain themselves financially are less likely to return to an abusive partner, because of financial hardship.

The Brampton and Caledon Community was delighted to provide computer equipment to the FLRC in 2014 to further develop the computer and skills training program at the FLRC. The FLRC and the Foundation view such programs as necessary grounding that will continue to assist the women and children at the Shelter.

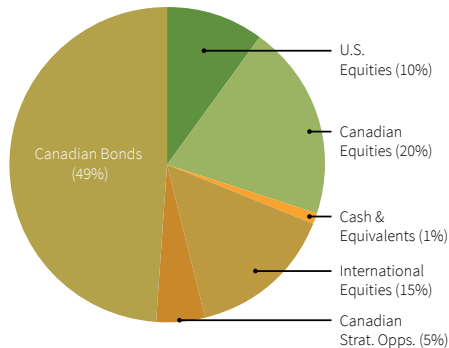
